Sub: - Application of the Chairman, Basaveshwar Veerashaiva Vidyavardhak Sangha, Bagalkot for establishment of New Homeopathic Medical College in the name and style of “BVV Sangha’s, BVVS Homoeopathic Medical College and Hospital, Bagalkot- 587101” with 60 seats in BHMS Course under 12 A of HCC Act, 1973, for the academic session 2019-20 - reg.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to the application dated 30.08.2018 of Chairman, Basaveshwar Veerashaiva Vidyavardhak Sangha, Bagalkot for establishment of New Homeopathic medical College in the name of “BVV Sangha’s, BVVS Homoeopathic Medical College and Hospital, Bagalkot” with 60 seats in BHMS Course under 12 A of HCC Act, 1973, for the academic session 2019-20.

2. After careful consideration of your proposal in terms of the provision of the HCC Act 1973, relevant regulations, inspection report and recommendation of the CCH; permission of the Central Government is hereby granted to the Chairman, Basaveshwar Veerashaiva Vidyavardhak Sangha, Bagalkot for establishment of New Homeopathic medical College in the name of “BVV Sangha’s, BVVS Homoeopathic Medical College and Hospital, Bagalkot- 587101” with 60 seats in BHMS Course under 12 A of HCC Act, 1973, for the academic session 2019-20.

3. The college administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teaching faculty, non-teaching staff, hospital staff and other requirements as per the provision of HCC (MSR), 2013 Regulations are in position before the admission of the first batch of students with 100 seats, under intimation to the Central Government and CCH.

4. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for 2nd BHMS course well in time as per the CCH norms which will be verified and reported by the CCH at least three months before the start of next professional session and accordingly, the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be issued.

5. It is further informed that 15% of the permitted intake capacity of 60 UG seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by the Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats shall be conducted by the concerned State

transferred to the concerned State Government to admit students as per their rules/ reservation policies/norms. **The permission to the college will stand withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the Central counseling for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under HCC Act & Regulations made thereunder. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of CCH and the Central Government.

7. The College shall submit an undertaking in the form of an affidavit duly notarized within one month from date of issue of this permission letter explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, Non-teaching staff of the College/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.

8. Further, the College shall submit an undertaking in the form of an Affidavit duly notarized to get permanent registration of the Teachers,/ Hospital Clinical Staff/ Consultant in concerned State Boards/ Council where the college/ hospital is located or Central Registration of CCH by 31st December, 2019 as per the decision conveyed vide CCH's letter no. 15-1/2018-CCH(3)/18510-18768, dated 16th January, 2019 and decided by the High Court of Delhi in W.P.No. 2369 of 2019, which will be verified by the Council during next visitation while considering the matter for grant of permission for the A.Y. 2020-21.

9. The College has to comply with the full requirements of HCC (MSR) Regulations, 2013 by 31st December, 2019 for continuing admissions during the subsequent year. A copy of the compliance report shall be submitted by the college to CCH under intimation to this Ministry. Subsequently, CCH shall verify the compliance well in time for considering the admissions during the Academic Year 2020-21 and furnish the recommendation to the Central Government.
